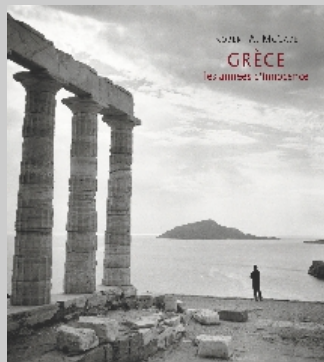


Grèce, les années d'innocence
